1. Introduction of the Programme

The Post Graduate Diploma in Disaster Management (PGDDM) is a specialized, multi-disciplinary post-graduate diploma programme designed to cultivate the expert-level knowledge and practical proficiency in anticipating risks, building resilient communities and contribute to sustainable development. Building upon the foundational concept acquired at the undergraduate level, this programme deepens learners' understanding of diverse domains – including agriculture, anthropology, business studies, geography, geology, engineering, environmental studies, mass communication, medical science, natural science, political science, psychology, sociology, traditional knowledge and practices – and their integrated application with the disaster management. At the post-graduate diploma level, disaster management transcends basic understanding of hazard, vulnerability, exposure and risk which focus on the specialised, research-driven and technology sophisticated methodologies. Learners are engaged with cutting-edge advancements in areas such as disaster governance, disaster medicines, disaster forensic, remote sensing and geographical information system, humanitarian conflict, supply chain management, climate change and emergency response management. The programme also offers focussed training on community-based disaster risk reduction, project development and reviews of policies and plans.

The comprehensive academic rigor and practical training and research-driven innovation equip graduates to make meaningful contributions at local, national and global level – to ensure safer, more prepared and resilient future through precise decision making, system and critical thinking essential for addressing complex real-world/life challenges. Post Graduate Diploma learners are trained not only to conduct reviews of hazard scenarios but also to contribute to the evolution of innovative solutions to identify and reduce vulnerabilities

through action-based research and grassroot level studies. The emphasis on the integrity, impartiality and ethical response during disaster situation ensures that graduates play the pivotal role in delivering humanitarian responses and maintaining the public trust during risk communication.

Graduates of Post Graduate Diploma in Disaster Management are prepared for leadership roles in disaster management authorities, banking sectors, development sectors, international and non-governmental organizations, academic institutions, public and private sectors. The advance skill sets and specialized knowledge gained through this programme position them to influence the disaster policy review, conduct independent research and drive consultancy services in the field of disaster management and public safety.
